Enhance Your Excel Skills: Vlookup and Pivot Tables

Learn the power of Excel's vlookup (vertical look up) and pivot tables to efficiently manage and analyze data. We'll walk you through real-life examples and then you will practice using a sample data set (or bring your own data set). We have tips for getting vlookup and pivot table to work on the first try!

- use a pivot table to analyze data by filtering for selected characteristics/categories
